POWER TO PROCEED

As a child I remember August always being a bittersweet time. After having three months of fun and sun, the coming horizon of nine months in school looked pretty ominous. While I would have loved for summer to last year round, in hindsight I realize that the season wouldn't have held meaning if it wasn't for the hard work that I put forth during the school year. Despite the grey clouds of homework and spelling tests that I knew the coming school year would bring, the time off gave me a renewed sense of vigor, almost an excitement, to get back to work in September. It was a cycle, just when I felt burnt out, summer would come just in time, and then this, too, would fade away as I entered another school year stronger and smarter than the year before.

A Christian's spiritual journey is similar with periods of great joys as well as those filled with great suffering. On the sixth of August we have the opportunity to celebrate the Feast of the Transfiguration, a pivotal event in Christ's ministry as He displayed for the first time His true glorious nature to His apostles. The power and majesty of the Transfiguration was a tremendous grace for Peter, James, and John; it provided them with increased strength and conviction, allowing them to endure the journey God paved for them, eventually ending

in martyrdom for both Peter and James and exile for John. It is no coincidence that the apostles Jesus took up on the holy mount were the same men He took with Him to the agony in the garden.

God does nothing in vain, which is a consoling truth. Jesus condemned the Sadducees and Pharisees when they asked for signs from heaven, but at the Transfiguration he gave just that, a heavenly sign. This event happened at its necessary time for its necessary purposes, just as God's movements within our own life serve their own particular purpose in our paths to sanctity. God alone knows what is best for each of us. We are called to trust in His will and submit with humility, patience, joy, and hope. Like Peter, we may be tempted to "build three tents" and live in a perpetual state of rest and consolation, but this is not our calling. The servant is no greater than the master. By looking at the life of Christ, we recognize the role these times of refreshment and respite play in God's work, as well as the necessity of work, struggle, and hardship in the Christian life. So, with September right around the corner, let's remember that everything from God is a blessing and, with our eyes set on the Lord, everything will be used for good.

This Immaculate Heart must be for us a refuge and the way that leads us to God.

This is that new generation born from this wonderful mother: Christ in Himself and in his Mystical Body. And Mary is the Mother of this progeny chosen by God to crush the head of the infernal serpent.

Thus we see that devotion to the Immaculate Heart of Mary must be established in the world by the same means of a true consecration, through conversion and self-giving. In the same way through the consecration, the bread and wine are converted into the Body and Blood of Christ, which were drawn with his very life from the Heart of Mary.

Hence it is that this Immaculate Heart must be for us a refuge and the way that leads us to God.

We thus constitute the retinue of the new generation created by God, drawing our supernatural life from the same life-giving source, the Immaculate Heart of Mary, who is the Mother of Christ and of his Mystical Body. Thus we are truly brothers and sisters of Christ, as He himself said: "My mother and my brethren are those who hear the word of God and do it (Lk. 8:21)."

This word of God is the bond which links all the children in the Heart of the Mother; there we hear the echo of the word of the Father, because God enclosed his eternal Word in the Heart of Mary; and it is from this Word that life comes to us: "If any one thirst, let him come to me and drink. He who believes in me, as scripture has said, 'Out of his heart shall flow rivers of living water (Jn. 7:37-38).'" In fact, we read in the Book of Isaiah: "For I will pour water on the thirsty land, and streams on the dry ground; I will pour my Spirit upon your descendants, and my blessing on your offspring (Is. 44:3)."

This blessed and watered land is the Immaculate Heart of Mary, and God wants our devotion to take root there, because it was for this very purpose that God placed so much love within the heart of the Mother of all human beings, who consecrates and converts her progeny into the Body and Blood of Christ,

her First-born, Son of God, the Word of the Father: "In him was life, and the life was the light of men...And the Word became flesh and dwelt among us, full of grace and truth; we have beheld his glory, glory as of the only Son from the Father (Jn. 1, 4:14)."

God began the work of our redemption in the Heart of Mary, given that it was through her "fiat" that the redemption began to come about: "And Mary said, Behold, I am the handmaid of the Lord, let it be to me according to your word (Lk. 1:38), "And the Word became flesh and dwelt among us (Jn 1, 14)." Thus, in the closest union possible between two human beings, Christ began, with Mary, the work of our salvation. The Christ's heart-beats are those of the heart of Mary, the prayer of Christ is the prayer of Mary, the joys of Christ are the joys of Mary; it was from Mary that Christ received the Body and Blood that are to be poured out and offered up for the salvation of the world. Hence, Mary, made one with Christ, is the co-Redemptrix of the human race. With Christ in her womb, with Jesus Christ in her arms, with Christ at Nazareth and in his public life; with Jesus Christ she climbed the hill of Calvary, she suffered and agonized with Him, receiving into her Immaculate Heart the last sufferings of Christ, his last words, his last agony and the last drops of his Blood, in order to offer them to the Father.

And Mary remained on earth in order to help her other children to complete the redeeming work of Christ, preserving it in her heart as a wellspring of grace - *Ave gratia plena* - in order to pass on to us the fruits of the life, passion and death of Jesus Christ, her son (pgs. 136-137).
